Dates in History

On December 17th, Amir Timur (Tamerlane) set camels loaded with wood and hay alight and charged them at the armored elephants of Sultan Nasir-u Din Mehmud's armies. Faced with the strange spectacle of camels flying straight at them with flames leaping from their backs, the elephants turned around and stampeded back toward their own lines. Timur capitalized on the disruption and secured an easy victory. As a result, Delhi was sacked and left in ruins.

1409 Leipzig University, in the Free State of Saxony, Germany, is one of the world's oldest universities. The university was founded on December 2nd by Frederick I, Elector of Saxony and his brother William II, Margrave of Meissen. Since its inception, the university has engaged in teaching and research for over 600 years without interruption.

1791 At the University of Pennsylvania, the first U.S. law school was established on December 15th. The school traces its origins to a series of lectures delivered by James Wilson, a signer of the United States Declaration of Independence and United States Constitution.
