Dates in History

1590 Pope Urban VII died on September 27th, thirteen days after being chosen as Pope, making his reign the shortest papacy in history. He was 69 years old upon his death.

Boston was founded by English Puritans 1630 fleeing religious persecution. A fleet of 11 ships carrying 700 people sailed from England to Massachusetts. At first the people settled at Charlestown, which had been founded the vear before. However, fresh water was scarce, so most of the new settlers moved across the river to a peninsula called Trimountaine. On September 7th, the new settlement was named Boston, after the town in England from which many of the settlers came.

Born in Corinth, Vermont, Alexander Lucius Twilight, an educator and legislator, was the third of six children of Mary and Ichabod Twilight. Indentured to a local farmer, Twilight worked in his spare time and eventually saved enough to purchase the last year of his indenture. Twilight went on to attend Randolph Academy and in 1821 graduated with the equivalent of a high-school degree and two years of college. He then entered Middlebury College and received his B.A. degree on September 9, 1823. Twilight was the first African American to graduate from an American college.

The physics journal Annalen der Physik 1905 published Albert Einstein's paper "Does the Inertia of a Body Depend Upon Its Energy Content?", on September 27th. The paper introduced the equation E=mc2, which says that energy and mass (matter) are interchangeable; they are different forms of the same thing.

The first 3D film, called *The Power of Love*, had its premiere at Los Angeles' Ambassador Hotel Theater on September 27th.
