Dates in History

Thomas Blood, disguised as a clergyman, attempted to steal England's Crown jewels from the Tower of London on May 9th. He was arrested as he tried to leave. In custody Blood refused to answer questions, instead repeating stubbornly, "I'll answer to none but the King himself." King Charles II asked, "What if I should give you your life?" to which Blood replied, "I would endeavor to deserve it, Sire!" Blood was not only pardoned but was given lands worth £500/year (\$114,686 in 2020).

Bob Rogers was acknowledged as the first American pro sports trainer when he was hired by the NY Athletic Club on May 1st.

The GWR 3700 Class steam locomotive No. 1904 3440 City of Truro was built for the Great Western Railway at Swindon Works to a design by George Jackson Churchward. On May 9th, the City of Truro became the first steam engine in Europe to exceed 100 MPH.

The American drama film Citizen Kane, 1941 directed by Orson Welles and starring himself, Joseph Cotten, and Dorothy Corningore, premiered May 1st at the Palace Theatre in New York City. The film was so obviously based on the tycoon William Randolph Hearst, who had built up the country's largest newspaper chain, that Hearst tried to buy the film so that he could destroy the negative. He failed but forbade any mention of the film in any of his newspapers.

Antonio Ramon Villaraigosa became the first 2005 Hispanic mayor of Los Angeles in 130 years in a runoff election on May 17th. As mayor, Villaraigosa spearheaded policies to improve student outcomes in the Los Angeles Unified School District, reduce city and highway traffic, and enhance public safety.
