Dates in History

- 1803 Before its purchase, Louisiana encompassed a large part of the American Midwest; from the Mississippi to the Rockies. The Senate authorized the purchase of 828,800 square miles for a total cost of \$15 million on November 29th.
- 1913 On November 3rd, American citizens received information of the new national income tax. A married man who lived with his wife, who was in receipt of an income of \$5,000, paid \$10 a year; if his income was \$10,000, he paid \$60 per year.
- The Holland Tunnel under the Hudson River 1927 opened on November 13th, connecting the island of Manhattan, New York City, with Jersey City, New Jersey.
- On November 12th, the Exchange National 1946 Bank of Chicago, Illinois, instituted the first drive-in banking service in America.
- The Mackinac Bridge opened on November 1st, connecting Mackinaw City and St. Ignace. Connecting the non-contiguous upper and lower peninsulas of Michigan, it became the longest suspension bridge between anchorages in the Western Hemisphere.
- Roger Clemens played 24 seasons as one of 1986 the most dominant pitchers in MLB history, tallying 354 wins, a 3.12 ERA, and 4,672 strikeouts. He won the American League's Cy Young Award on November 12th. It was the first of seven wins, the most of any pitcher in MLB history.
- 1992 On November 3rd, Democrat Bill Clinton was elected President of the United States, defeating incumbent President George H. W. Bush. A former Arkansas Governor, he became the first two-term Democratic President since F. D. Roosevelt.
